

Town Hall with Town Hall well



The Town Hall of Bad Langensalza was built between 1742 and 1752 from local travertine stone. The Saxon and Thuringian lions sit above the former water source of the town, the town hall well of 1582.

The Baroque Town Hall with its tower is the modern-day seat of the town council. Of the Medieval preceding structures only cellar vaults and the tower remain. The cellars can be viewed in the course of special guided tours. A popular feature is the ringing of the bells at the town hall at noon and 6 pm: 32 bells above the entrance are accompanied by a procession of figures. The trumpeter is followed by Hermann von Salza, Christoph Wilhelm Hufeland and Friedrich Gottlieb Klopstock.
