

Hainich National Park

With the motto “Let nature be nature”, the “primeval forest in the middle of Germany” – the Hainich National Park – inspires its visitors. It has a size of 7,500 hectares, was established in 1997 and has been part of the UNESCO World Heritage since 2011.

In spring, the Hainich National Park attracts people with its rich variety of early bloomers. In May, hikers are delighted by the thick carpets of wild garlic. In the wilderness of the natural beech forest, wild cats, woodpeckers, bats and Co. find their homes. Numerous events on environmental education are dedicated to this biological variety on the largest non-used deciduous forest area in Germany the most popular attraction of which is the canopy walkway. At its foot, the National Park Centre also provides information about the UNESCO World Heritage “Primeval Beech Forests of the Carpathians and Old Beech Forests in Germany“ to which the Hainich National Park belongs. From the total of 19 excellently signposted paths and circular trails, you can marvel at age-old beech forest remains and impressive tree veterans.

National Park Centre of Thiemsburg



The 700 m² large exhibition “Discover the Hainich secrets“ is unparalleled: the forest habitat is presented here in a modern and interactive way – with special focus on the beech. The secret star of the Hainich Park is hidden in a multi-vision box – a short film showing the wildcat in its natural habitat. The motto “Let Nature be Nature“ runs like a red thread through the whole exhibition: early bloomers, creatures of the underworld, migratory birds. What can be found among other things is for example a “love nest”, a trial canopy walkway, a cosy sitting corner with story-telling eggs and an experimental platform. It is possible here to acknowledge the value of nature, to be inspired to contemplate and to promote sustainable action. The exhibition is barrier-free.
